ACTION TAKEN REPORT BASED ON FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS, ALUMNI AND TEACHERS

1. Academic aspects – Revision of Syllabus

a) B.Sc, Botany syllabus

The syllabus which was revised in the year 2011 in which Choise Based Credit system was implemented the following papers 1. Biofertilizers and Biopesticides 2. Horticulture and Landscaping were included as Non-Major Elective, which the Botany students cannot opt. This lacuna was brought to the notice of the University Authorities, as our Faculty members are in the Board of studies, the same was rectified and the papers were brought under Core course / Elective course during Revision of the syllabus in 2016.

The paper on Biotechnology and Bioinformatics, Medical and Applied Botany, Biotechnology and Bioinformatics were also included in the syllabus based on the feedback

b) M.Sc. Botany syllabus

In the 2011 syllabus the IV semester included Four theory Papers viz. Research Methodology, Bioinstrumentation and Biological Techniques, Food Processing and Preservation, Horticulture and Landscaping and Project. Since there were repetitions of portions in Research Methodology and Biological Techniques, combining of these two papers as a single paper and the Introduction of a paper on Plant Tissue culture and Practical on Research Methodology and Plant Tissue culture was done in the revised syllabus in 2016. The hands on training of students on Research Methodology and Plant tissue culture have made our students competent. Apart from this a course on Forestry and Wood Science was also introduced to improve the employability of students.

b) B.Sc. and M.Sc. Physics syllabus

Based on feedback and requisition from the Alumni new and novel course on *Nuclear Physics* was introduced in the B.Sc. Physics curriculum with the concurrence of the University. Likewise the paper on *Advanced physics* was introduced in *M.Sc. syllabus*.

c) M.Sc. Computer Science

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Based on feedback and requisition from the Alumni new and job oriented course on Cloud computing and Artificial Intelligence were introduced in the M.Sc. syllabus

2. Introduction of New Courses

Based on the Feedback from the Alumni and Teachers, new job oriented courses B.Sc. Environmental Sciences and B.Sc. Statistics were introduced from the Academic year 2017-18. Apart from this, M.Phil. programmes have been introduced in the department of Mathematics, Commerce and Economics.

3. Student Support Facility

i) Canteen Facility

Canteen facility is run for the benefit of the students and faculty members in the college campus.

ii) Health Centre

A Health centre was established inside the college campus by the Youth Red Cross to cater to the immediate first needs and a First Aid kit was also given to all departments and office.

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
